Mikael Lindnord, one of the team, fed the stray dog some meatballs and the dog loyally started following the Adventure Racing Team. The dog went with them through rivers, climbed hills on the hikes and went

mud-deep on treks. Even when they tried to get rid of the dog, he refused to go. The team named him Arthur and Mikael Lindnord adopted the dog, taking him back to his native country of Sweden. After four months in quarantine and being looked after, Arthur was released to his new loving family in March 2015. An amazing and really touching story of the loyalty of one dog.
