QUESTIONS FOR AFTER THE SKETCH

- 1. What did it take for Moses to leave his comfortable situation and make the trip back to Pharaoh?
- 2. What does this mean for you? How can we learn from Moses?
- 3. How did God agree to go with Moses and support him?
- 4. How does God support us today? How do we hear God's voice?

Zipporah (wife of Moses) and her father, Jethro - sitting around doing general work - looking out and about asking, 'where's Moses?'

Moses - (bursts in). The Lord has told me he's going to rescue his people from slavery in Egypt.

Zipporah - Moses, your face is glowing - where are your sandals, they cost a wad of Egyptian dollars from the market, you haven't lost them again have you. You did put on the sun protection 15 the Egyptian Sun Tan Care Magazine recommends didn't you?

Moses - Yes, yes, of course. I'm not glowing because of that, I've been with the Lord. His holiness is shining from my face.

Zipporah and Jethro (together) - are you sure, that's amazing, how, wow, where were you, what happened..?

Moses - One at a time. I was after a lost sheep and the Lord appeared to me in a burning bush..

(Zipporah and Jethro exchange concerned glances). Jethro - Moses, have you been on the Reed Wine again?

Moses - No, can't stand the stuff. No, this is true. I saw a burning bush.

Jethro - Moses son, it was a burning bush because it was on fire. That's what happens with bushes in the sun that catch fire, they burn.

Moses - No, you don't understand. The bush was on fire but it didn't burn up.

Zipporah - So you haven't been on the Reed Wine, it's really true. I can tell.

Moses - Yes, it was real.

Jethro - Forgive me for being the one to point out the obvious but I still think you've been on the old moonshine..

Jethro - OK, son, I'm phoning Cairo Hospital. They have people who can help.

I mean if it was a land of gold and fit women, I'd be interested, but milk and honey? What a horrible combination, I mean imagine that for lunch everyday..

Zipporah - Father, you're being out of order here, it's not a joking matter.

Take a seat, I'd tell the waiter to take a hike...

Jethro - (pauses) Well, son, if you believe it, you do what you want. I'm going to make some lunch, some nice tasty meat..
